# **CNLSC Vehicle Policy**

### **Background**

The club has permission to park up to 20 vehicles in the Grand Flanuer Beach parkland. This privilege was granted by the Liverpool Council as a result of considerable lobbying by the club over a period of many years. The purpose of this concession is to allow boats to be transported to the rigging area by motor vehicle thereby avoiding significant man handling. It is important that club members recognize that this is a privilege and not a right. The council is both the land owner and the local governing body and has the right to revoke access if they see fit. The expectation is that no park user should be adversely affected or put in danger by any actions on the part of our drivers. To avoid the potential loss of this privilege it is important that club members adhere to the requirements outlined below.

### **Driving Rules:**

Drivers must obey all of the Australian Road Rules apart from an exception where club boats may be towed up the hill by vehicles. The following additional conditions apply:

- Only vehicles driven by club members or driven by parents transporting junior club members are allowed in the parkland.
- Vehicles over 2500Kg tare weight are not allowed in the parkland.
- 5 Km/h Speed limit.
- Any person being transported by a motor vehicle must remain wholly within the vehicle in full accordance with the Australian Road Rules.
- Vehicles must not be driven on the sand.
- Where there is a possibility that non CNLSC vehicles could enter the parkland the chain gate should be closed after entry.
- All equipment on club boats must be secured before being towed.
- The towing vehicle must be attached to the trolley's towing trace either by fitting the eye of the trace securely over the tow ball or by shackle or snap hook through the vehicle's rear securing ring.
- People assisting with the towing process should keep a safe distance from the vehicle and boat while it is being towed.
- No person is allowed in or on a boat or trolley while it is being towed.
- No person is allowed to travel in the tender boat while it is being towed.

## Parking Rules:

The accompanying diagram shows the general locations approved for parking.

- All vehicles parked within the parkland must display a current vehicle parking permit inside the windscreen of the vehicle. Parking permits are available from the sign-on table in the club house and must be returned before leaving the site.
- Vehicles towing boats may be parked close to the beach but not beyond the crest of the storm water containment ridge that separates the beach from the parkland.
- Vehicles towing boats may also be parked further up the grassy slope toward the tree line.

- Vehicles must only be parked on the western half of the beach parkland. The eastern half is reserved for picnickers. Drivers should be aware of this and park economically without excessive distances between vehicles so that all parked vehicles can be confined to the western half of the park.
- Vehicles not towing boats should be parked on the crest of the ridge inside the chain gate to the north of the boatshed (as per the diagram).
